






# Tourism Food for Good

Co-Creating Sustainable
Food Systems in the Tourism Sector

## What is Tourism Food for Good?

Food for Good is a global initiative that brings together policymakers, academics, practitioners, civil society and local communities to redesign the way food is produced, sourced, served, consumed, redistributed and reused in tourism. It responds to the urgent need for innovation and collaboration at the intersection of tourism and food systems, given the sector's significant influence, with the aim to contribute to both development imperatives and food security solutions.

The initiative seeks to co-create the 2040 Impact Roadmap for Sustainable Food Systems in Tourism, a globally applicable framework to identify and operationalize pathways to transform the tourism food system. Based on action-research and a robust systems approach, the Roadmap will identify leverage points to accelerate circularity, build collective approaches for cutting food waste, and strengthening local food economies in tourism destinations. The first pilot will take place in Cabo Verde.

The initiative builds on UN Tourism's Global Roadmap for Food Waste Reduction in Tourism, which was developed in collaboration with UNEP, is powered by CRSD Cambridge's Impact Roadmapping and Policy Boot Camp methodologies, and supported by the philanthropic and practical engagement of the TUI Care Foundation.

## **Towards the Tourism Food for Good Alliance**

The Food for Good initiative lays the foundation for the Tourism Food for Good Alliance, a UN Tourism led collaborative platform to transform food systems in tourism. The Alliance will bring together public and private actors to co-create solutions that promote circular food systems, reduce food waste, and support sustainable agriculture.

It encourages aligned interventions, shared learning, and collective impact, contributing to key SDGs such as zero hunger, climate action, and responsible consumption and production.

# **Spotlight: TUI Field to Fork**

The TUI Field to Fork programme promotes sustainable food supply chains by supporting local agriculture, reducing food waste, and improving food quality and traceability in tourism destinations. It builds bridges between farmers, hotels, and tourists, enhancing community livelihoods and environmental sustainability.

TUI Field to Fork provides a hands-on platform to pilot and scale many of the solutions cocreated in the Food for Good initiative.
